## A Year in Review

'There can be only one.' This season, that was Fuquay Nine. They finished off 2014 with a 208.83 to 197.17 victory over Power Rangers, giving them an 18 - 7 final record. Fuquay Nine's good standing can be attributed, in part, to their relief pitchers, who ranked 4th in the league.

When it came to relief pitchers however, nobody had a better group than Ball Hawks, who got 27.32 points per game out of the position. Francisco Rodriguez was the key member of that stalwart corps, scoring 330.5 points for Ball Hawks this season. Meanwhile, Coach Moore could only dream about good relief pitcher play this year, as West Raleigh Moundchargers' relief pitchers were the worst in the league, coming up with only 14.91 points per game.

Turning our attention to the draft, it's clear that Coach Rudd hit it out of the park with his first three picks. He picked up Anthony Rizzo, Brad Miller, and Giancarlo Stanton, who put up better production than any other team's top picks (+178.6 Points vs. Position Average). Coach Matthew Burkett was the mirror image of Coach Rudd. His first three picks were Wilin Rosario, Martin Prado, and Andrelton Simmons. Ouch.

Holland's best game came in week 18, when he put up 36.5 points in leading Ellicott City Black Sox to victory over Raleigh Middle Fingers. Despite his performance this year, Ellicott City Black Sox wound up tied for 7th place during the regular season with a 10 - 13 record.

Mauer Patch Kids struggled to find the right mix with their outfielders, who averaged only 30.52 points per game. That was worse than any other team this year. Marcell Ozuna shares a big part of the blame for that lackluster group's performance, averaging 5.9 points in his 11 starts for Mauer Patch Kids this year. Those outfielder problems go a long way towards explaining why Mauer Patch Kids finished the regular season with an 8 - 15 record.
