A Year in Review

Coach Brake took on all comers this season, and had what it took to prevail. [Power Rangers](#) finished off 2015 with a 246 to 123.5 victory over Spivey's Corner Knockouts, giving them an 18 - 7 final record. Their good standing can be attributed, in part, to their starting pitchers, who ranked 2nd in the league.

When it came to starting pitchers however, nobody had a better group than Fostoria Screwballs, who got 60 points per game out of the position. [Jake Arrieta](#) was the key member of that stalwart corps, scoring 507.8 points for Fostoria

Screwballs this season. Meanwhile, Coach Lipps could only dream about good starting pitcher play this year, as Raleigh Middle Fingers' starting pitchers were the worst in the league, coming up with only 30.24 points per game.

Ball Hawks had lots of positional problems, which drove them into the ditch at 8 - 15. That was the worst mark in the league. Ball Hawks can place a good chunk of blame on [Corey Dickerson](#), who fell a collective 172 points short of the league average hitter while in the starting lineup, doing more damage than any other hitter this year.

Exceedingly Average

No team had a more 'ho-hum' season than Durham Indians. They ended up with 183.9 points per game for the regular season, which was the closest to average of any team in the league. Not surprisingly, that average point total led to a very average 12 - 11 record.

Fostoria Screwballs got big efforts from their starting pitchers, who put up a best-in-the-league 60 points per game. Jake Arrieta was the leader of that pack, scoring 507.8 points for Fostoria Screwballs this season. The strong starting pitcher group helps explain why Fostoria Screwballs wrapped up the regular season tied for having the 3rd best record at 15 - 8.

It Couldn't Be Worse

Worst In Show

While in Hickory Scorpions' starting lineup, Haren fell 94.9 points short of the average starting pitcher. Haren's worst game came in week six, when he couldn't do any better than -3.2 points in a losing effort versus Raleigh Middle Fingers. The bad performance of Haren helps explain why Hickory Scorpions wound up tied for 7th place during the regular season with a 10 - 13 record.

They were led by [Paul Goldschmidt](#), [David Price](#), and [Nelson Cruz](#), who collectively finished 335.8 points above their positional averages while in the starting lineup.

West Raleigh Moundchargers struggled to find the right mix with their relief pitchers, who averaged only 14.1 points per game. That was worse than any other team this year. [Joakim Soria](#) shares a big part of the blame for that lackluster group's performance, averaging 12.2 points in his 18 starts for West Raleigh Moundchargers this year. Those relief pitcher problems go a long way towards explaining why West Raleigh Moundchargers finished the regular season with an 11 - 12 record.

Ball Hawks were the most top-heavy squad in the league this year, with a huge gap between their top three players and their next three best starters. The group of [Clayton Kershaw](#), [Mark Melancon](#), and [Michael Brantley](#) wound up at +416.9 Points Vs Positional Average (PPA) while in the starting lineup this year. Their next three best players, [Aroldis Chapman](#), [Ben Revere](#), and [DJ LeMahieu](#), finished up well behind at +42! .1 PPA.
